

Adoption Assistance or Permanency Care Assistance, and Medicaid for Breast and Cervical Cancer programs managed care expansions

Starting September 1, 2017, Adoption Assistance or Permanency Care Assistance (AAPCA), and Medicaid for Breast and Cervical Cancer (MBCC) program members will be moved from Medicaid Fee-For-Service to Medicaid managed care. These members will be added into existing programs; therefore, your existing STAR, STAR Kids and STAR+PLUS agreements with Amerigroup will support the AAPCA and MBCC managed care expansions.

Individuals in the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services AAPCA programs will begin receiving their Medicaid services through managed care. Most AAPCA clients will be enrolled in the STAR managed care program. Clients who receive Supplemental Security Income and clients who have a disability, as determined by the Social Security Administration or the state of Texas, will be enrolled in the STAR Kids managed care program.

Women in the MBCC program will receive all their Medicaid services through STAR+PLUS. This includes cancer treatment. In addition, STAR+PLUS members receive:

- Unlimited prescriptions.
- A service coordinator to help them find the right providers for their needs.
- A PCP to make sure all of their needs are addressed.
- Value-added services (extra services).
