

Georgia Foster Care program — initial assessments

Georgia Families 360°_{SM} is a program that delivers care to children, youth, and young adults in foster care, children, and youth receiving adoption assistance benefits and youth in a nonsecure placement in the juvenile justice system. Our Georgia Families 360°_{SM} program is required to coordinate and monitor completion of three initial assessments when a youth is enrolled in our program. These include a:

- Medical assessment with 10 days.
- Dental assessment within 10 days.
- Trauma assessment within 15 days of enrollment.

We believe that providers play a pivotal role in the success and timeliness of these assessments. We can only succeed by working collaboratively with you and other caregivers. Providers become eligible for an enhanced value-based payment for seeing the member within the timeframe and providing Amerigroup Community Care a copy of the medical record (within three business days of the visit).

Assessments are conducted on all newly enrolling members. Please note:

- Prior authorizations are not required for the assessments.
- There are no restrictions to the frequency in which these assessments are conducted if the need is based upon the member being newly enrolled in Georgia Families 360°_{SM} .
 - For example, if a child has had their yearly early and periodic screening, diagnostic, and testing (EPSDT) exam but then enters foster care, they should receive a new EPSDT exam.

The screening and provider guidelines are below:

Dental health	 Each child 1 year of age and older shall receive: A dental exam within 10 calendar days of receipt of eligibility. Any and all treatment, as directed by the child's assessing dentist.
