

## Pregnancy Medicaid and Planning for Healthy Babies®: FAQ

### What is pregnancy Medicaid?

Pregnancy Medicaid, or Right from the Start Medicaid (RSM) in Georgia, pays for medical care for pregnant women, including labor and delivery, for 12 months after they give birth.

### Who is eligible?

Pregnant women may qualify if their monthly income does not exceed the federal poverty level limit.

### What is covered?

Pregnant women who qualify are entitled to the full range of Medicaid covered services. Additional services include physician’s visits, prescription drugs, and inpatient and outpatient hospital services.

### What is Planning for Healthy Babies® (P4HB)?

P4HB provides no-cost family planning services to eligible women in Georgia.

### Who is eligible?

- Women ages 18 through 44 who meet monthly family income limits
- Women who do not receive Medicaid are eligible for family planning services
- Women who receive Medicaid and deliver a baby weighing less than 3 pounds, 5 ounces are only eligible for Resource Mother Outreach services
- Women who deliver a baby weighing less than 3 pounds, 5 ounces and do not receive Medicaid or are losing Medicaid coverage are eligible for interpregnancy care services

### What is covered?

<p><b>This program covers:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>■ Annual family planning exams</li> <li>■ Contraceptive services and supplies</li> <li>■ Family planning-related service visits and follow-ups (up to four per year)</li> <li>■ Treatment of major complications related to family planning services</li> <li>■ Counseling and referrals for social services such as the Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Program</li> <li>■ Tubal ligation (sterilization)</li> <li>■ Multivitamins with folic acid</li> <li>■ Hepatitis B and tetanus diphtheria vaccines for participants ages 18 to 20</li> </ul>	<p><b>This program provides a resource mother to help participants:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>■ Adopt healthy behaviors such as healthy eating and smoking cessation</li> <li>■ Comply with primary care appointments and arrange for nonemergency medical transportation</li> <li>■ Schedule regular preventive health visits and appropriate immunizations for their children</li> <li>■ Comply with treatment and medications for chronic health conditions</li> <li>■ Access social services support</li> <li>■ Connect to community resources such as the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for WIC</li> </ul>	<p><b>This program covers all Family Planning and Resource Mother Outreach services <i>plus</i>:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>■ Primary care services</li> <li>■ Five office/outpatient visits per year</li> <li>■ Management and treatment of chronic diseases</li> <li>■ Substance abuse treatment (detoxification and intensive outpatient rehab)</li> <li>■ Limited dental benefits</li> <li>■ Prescription medications to treat chronic conditions</li> </ul>

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
