

Is Your Clinic Losing A VBP For Well-Care Visits?

If your clinic provides health care for children and is losing a VBP for well-care visits, we may be able to help and **your clinic can earn up to \$10,000** in the process!

In our well-child improvement efforts, **3 out of 4 clinics improved** their well-child visit rates **1/3** by **more than 10% in just 5 short months!**

Washington State Department of Health, in partnership with the **Medicaid Managed Care Organizations**, is sponsoring another Clinic Pilot Project (Apr-Sept 2021).

This pilot will focus on identifying the clinic rate for Well-Child Visits for children 0-21 years of age, and increasing the rate of Well-Child Visits for two age groups selected by the clinic.



WHAT THE CLINIC WILL GET:

PARTNERSHIP

Work with an MCO to reconcile the list of patients attributed to the clinic (the list used to report the official rate of well-child visits for patients served)

EXPERIENCE

using MCO reports (Master Roster, Care Gap Reporting, & Add/Drop Reporting)

LEARN TIPS

Reported by other clinics and what parents report is helpful to get well-care visits completed

INCENTIVE

Requires completion of 5 tasks and varies based on the number of children attributed to the clinic by the partnering MCO

Up-to-date Enrollee Awareness

rosters that can be maintained beyond the pilot project

QUALIFICATIONS

- Serve at least **250 Medicaid managed care patients 0-21 yrs of age** with at least one MCO
- Well-Child Visit rate is believed to be **below the State average**
- **Clinic willingness to partner** with that MCO to **complete 5 tasks** to raise the rate of well-child visits among children 0-21 years of age in the **April – Sept 2021** timeframe. Final reporting is early October of 2021.
